Each May, the TAMR issues a Directory of all its members in place of the regular HOTBOX. You will notice that this Directory bears the number 211, this is a sequential number that appears on all TAMR publications. On your address label, you will find such a number. These numbers are used in determining when your membership expires in the TAMR. The number on your address label is the last issue of the HOTBOX or Directory to which you are entitled under your current subscription. A renewal notice is enclosed with that issue to facilitate your renewal.

This listing provides the following information about our member. First his name, followed by his address and telephone number. The number in brackets after his name indicate his age, if the letters "L", "S", or "A" appear in the bracket, that means the member is an honorary Life member or an Associate member, respectively. The letter "S" after the brackets indicates that he is a sustaining member. His railroad is the "Soowauke Lines" and the last line of the listing can be interpreted using the following key:

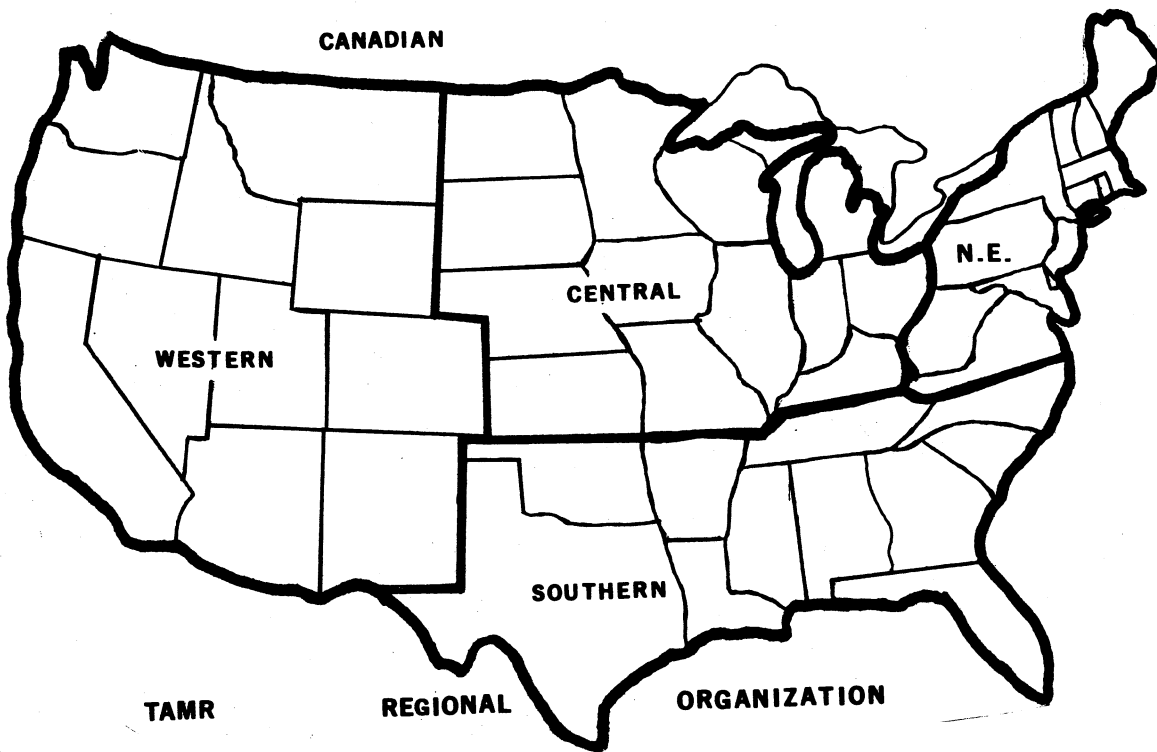

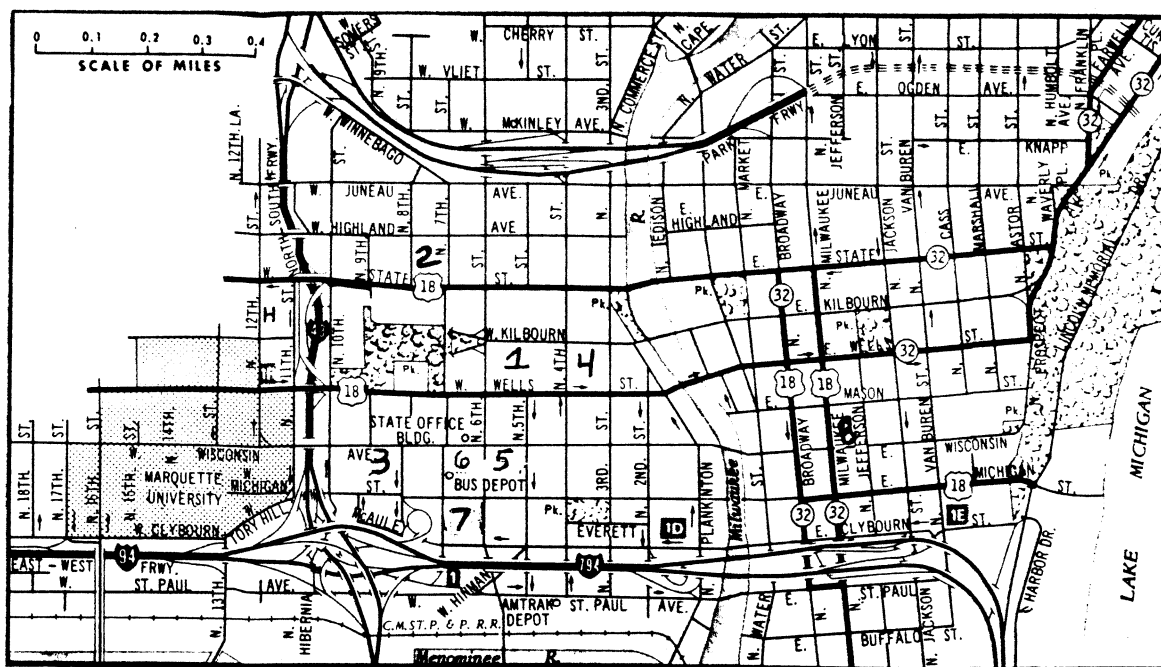

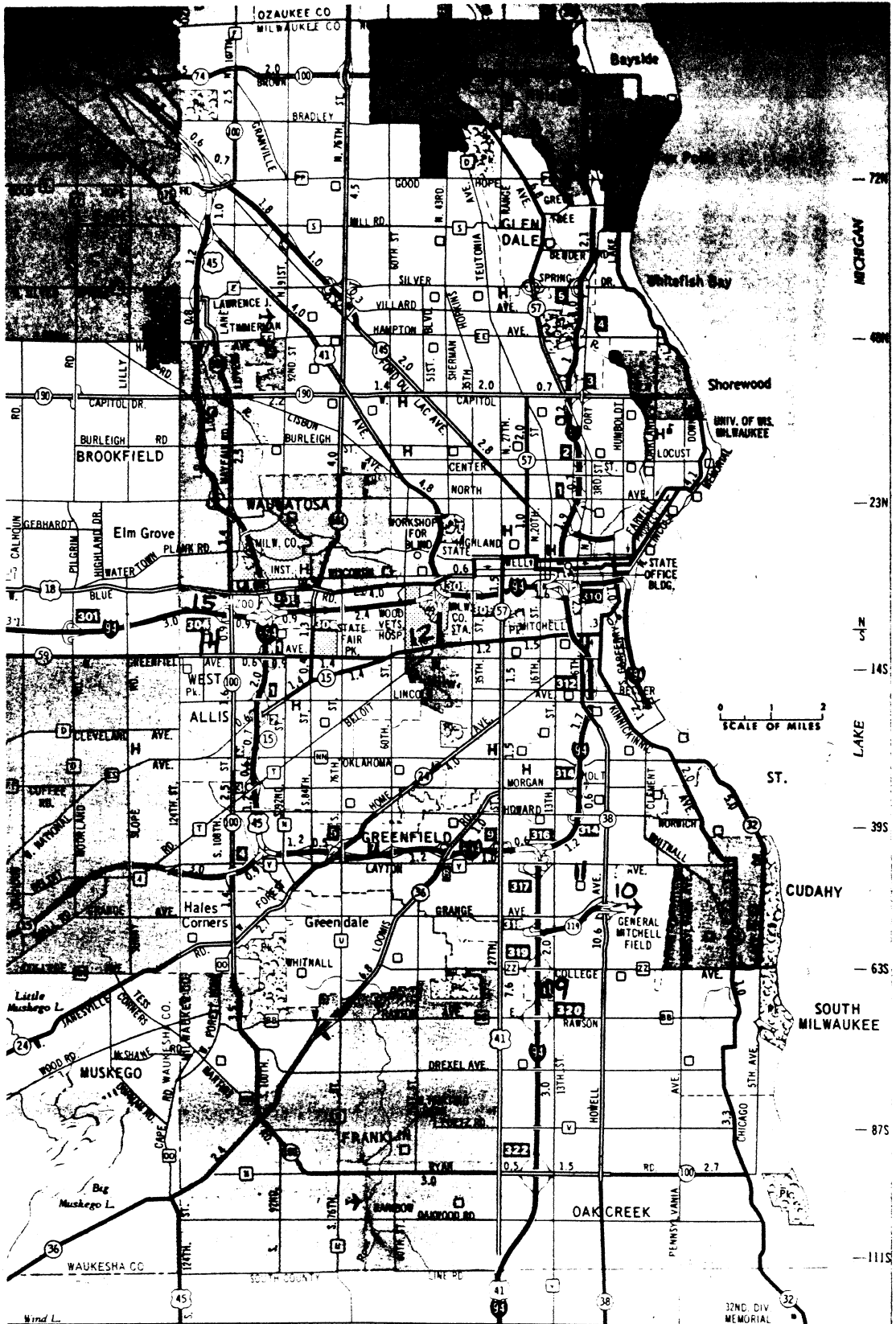
