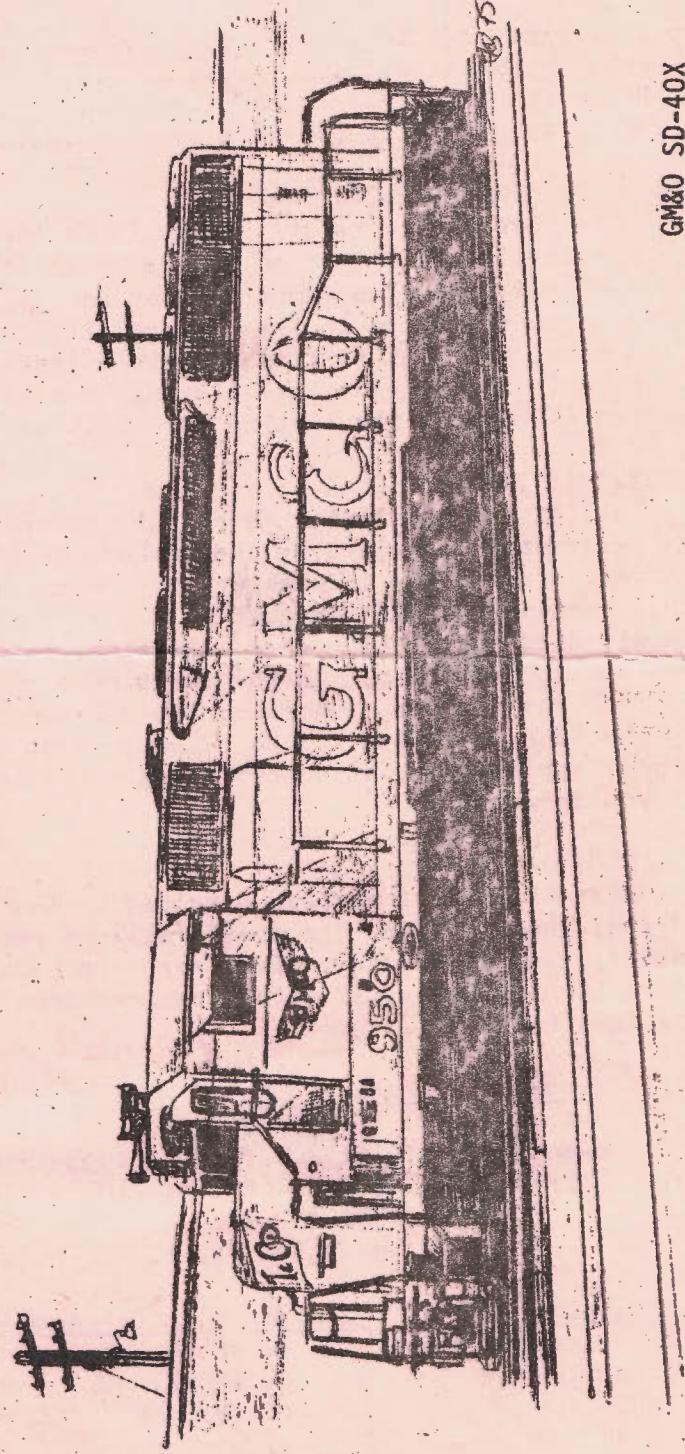

HOW TO USE THIS DIRECTORY---

The Directory consists primarily of two different member listings, the alphabetical listing and the regional listing. The alphabetical listing only gives the member's name and region. Addresses and other information are found in the regional listing. Thus, if you know a member's name, and want to find out his address, you should first look up his name in the alphabetical listing to determine which region he is in. By then looking in the listing for that region, you will find his address.

ABOUT THIS INFORMATION---

All of the information herein is theoretically taken directly from the information provided by the members on their application blanks. However, some of the information was taken from the previous Directory since certain persons (through no fault of their own) did not renew with the standard application form last time, and this was the only record for them in the files. PIKE CODING---

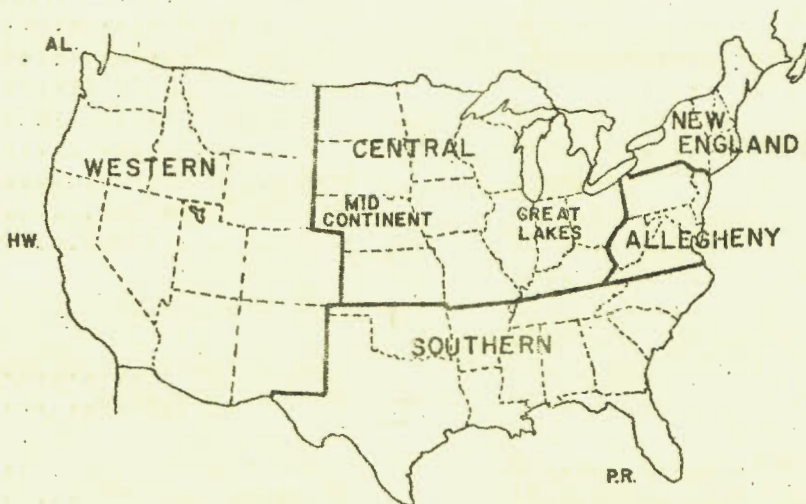
Most of the information provided in the region listings, such as address, phone number, and model railroad name are self-explanatory. However, the 'pike code', given for each member who supplied the necessary information on his application requires some explanation. The coding is explained below:

REGIONS



ONE OF THE FEATURES OF THE TEEN ASSOCIATION OF MODEL RAILROADING HAS BEEN ITS REGIONAL STRUCTURE. REGIONS WERE FIRST STARTED ABOUT 1966, AND THERE HAS ALWAYS BEEN SOME SORT OF ORGANIZATION OF THEM, ALTHOUGH MANY OF THEM HAVE OPERATED SPORADICALLY AT BEST. THE BOUNDARIES WITHIN THE US HAVE CHANGED VERY LITTLE UNTIL 1975, WHEN MARK SOLOMON ANNOUNCED THE CONSOLIDATION OF SOME REGIONS AND THE DIVISION OF ONE TO PROVIDE REGIONS WITH ENOUGH PEOPLE TO MAKE THEM VIABLE. THE OVERSEAS REGIONS BEGAN MUCH LIKE THE OTHERS AND HAVE NOW PROGRESSED TO VIRTUAL INDEPENDENT STATUS, SHARING PUBLICATION MATERIAL, RECOGNIZING EACH OTHERS' MEMBERS, AND HAVING THEIR OWN OFFICERS, BUT STILL A FUNCTIONAL PART OF THE TAMR.
